PAWNEE CUSD #11 SCHOOL PROFILE

Pawnee High School (CEEB = 143-385) is a four-year public school which is accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education. The district consists of one attendance center, including one high school (9th- 12th), one junior high (7th-8th), and one elementary school (Pre-Kindergarten-6th), which is all housed under one roof. Total school population has been consistently around the 600-650 level for the past two decades. The district's average class size (18 students) is below the state average and offers an at-risk program for 2-5 year olds. The high school operates efficiently on a modified block schedule and has proven itself as one of the higher academic schools in the area.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must successfully complete 30 academic units of credit within their four year plan. The following criteria have been established by the Board of Education required to receive a Pawnee Community Unit District #11 diploma:

4 credits English ½ credit Consumer Ed.

3 credits Science ½ credit Health 3 credits Math 4 credits PE

2½ credits Social Studies

1 credit Fine Arts, Industrial Tech, or Business

All students must also pass a qualifying examination on the State and Federal Constitutions.

CLASS STANDING

Class standing will be determined by the number of credits earned. Credits may be assessed and a new class standing assigned each semester. Class standing will be determined as follows:

Freshman under 7 credits
Sophomore 7 to 14.5 credits
Junior 15 to 21.5 credits
Senior 22 or more credits

GRADING SCLAE

The Board of Education has adopted a nine-week grading period for Pawnee students. In each semester there are two nine week grading periods. Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester average, the semester exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
