ILLNESSES

It's STILL the dreaded cold and flu season, and unfortunately, we are seeing our share at PGS. As stated in the handbook, please do not send your ill child(ren) to school. If your child is running a fever, vomiting, and/or has diarrhea, please keep him/her at home until s/he has been symptom free for at least 24 hours *without* medication. Students who receive antibiotics must be on them for at least 24 hours before returning to school. Also, if your child is ill and needs to be sent home from school, it is the parent/guardian's responsibility to have the child picked up within an hour of notification. Please help us prevent the spread of illnesses and keep our students and staff healthy.
